M.U.D. NOTES NEWS FROM THE CORNERSTONE MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

- Trash collection by Texas Pride is done under contract with the MUD. You are billed for the service as part of your water/sewer cost. Please contact the MUD Board for more detailed information.
- Streets in the Creekstone and Cimarron Subdivision will be closed periodically during the next two years as part of a storm sewer improvement project.
- The MUD is partnering with Harris County to construct sidewalks along South Mason Road from Highland Knolls to the Fort Bend County Line.

This is a reminder that the new roof must be approved by the Cornerstone Place Architectural Control Committee BEFORE work begins.

You get approval by submitting a Home Improvement Form to **Irwin Community Management** (*See contact information below*). Forms are available at <u>http://www.cornerstoneplace.org</u> or by contacting the management company.

Failure to receive approval can result in having to redo the roof if it does not meet community standards.

FRONT PORCH/BACK PATIO DESIGN IDEAS THAT WORK

Depending on the space available, a porch or covered patio can serve as a small haven to escape bad weather or an outdoor room for relaxing with family and friends. Whether you have a tiny platform just wider than your front door or an expansive wraparound veranda in the backyard, you can make your porch or patio an attractive and welcoming space. Here are a few design tips for most outdoor entry spaces, big or small.

Give your door a color boost

Painting the front door with an unusual color will draw the visitor's eye and set you apart from other homes. Think about updating the hardware if it has seen better days. Be sure to get advanced approval for the color from our HOA.

Spruce up the floor

Natural wood decking or patio covers can be refreshed with a good cleaning, sanding and new stain or specially formulated porch-and-patio paint. Since most of us here in the Houston area don't have wood floored porches, and if your budget allows, you could opt for ceramic, porcelain or stone tiles for an interesting, low-upkeep solution.

Add an outdoor rug

Select a throw rug that will resist moisture and sun. Or avoid the hassle by painting a "rug" right on to the patio floor.

Style with planters

Containers of green or flowering plants can add a friendly and homey touch, especially where space is tight. Just remember to water frequently.

Furniture that fits

Measure your space before selecting furniture, then pick pieces that suit your patio's style and purpose. Wooden rockers impart a nostalgic feel, while metal loungers offer a more modern vibe.

EASY BACKYARD HOME IMPROVEMENTS

More prospective homebuyers are adding "outdoor entertaining space" to their search criteria. While you may be tempted to go full-tilt on an outdoor kitchen, pool and "she-shed," you can make more price-conscious choices that are eye-catching and useful. If you already have a patio or deck, make sure the furniture is arranged in welcoming seating areas or dining zones. Then perk up the rest of the area with these easy enhancements:

Go green

Adding plants is a quick way to add color and freshness to an outdoor space. Be sure any existing lawn, trees or shrubbery are trimmed.

Fire feature

A fire pit can be a great addition to an outdoor space, especially when we have cooler nighttime temperatures. A permanent installation can be done at relatively low cost, or a portable pit can provide the same ambience and be stored away in when not in use.

Screening and shade

Strategic placement of key items can protect guests from too much sun or prying eyes. A pergola offers shade and defines an outdoor room. A freestanding patio umbrella can also lend shade. Taller plants or vines can provide some privacy, as can fabric drapes artfully tied back to posts. You might also consider using various shapes and sizes of sunsails as a more affordable solution without building an extensive (and expensive) patio cover.

Light it up

It's easy to add ground-level lighting without installing a hardwired system. Solar-powered, dusk-activated stake lights can be driven into garden beds or along walkways. Outdoor-rated string lights add charm when wound along fences, around tree branches, along the eaves or on awning supports.
