M.U.D. NOTES

NEWS FROM THE CORNERSTONE MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

- Streets in the Creekstone and Cimarron Subdivision will be closed periodically during the next two years as part of a storm sewer improvement project. WORK CONTINUES
- The MUD is partnering with Harris County to construct sidewalks along South Mason Road from Highland Knolls to the Fort Bend County Line. Project is moving ahead
- Contruction has started on widening South Mason Road. There will be traffic problems for the next few months.
- Recent county proposal to make neighborhoods pay all of the cost for constable deputies instead of the current 70%. Proposal was withdrawn after citizens comments to commissioners.



Removing valuables from vehicles and front yards and securing houses and cars provides the best protection for your property. Remember to stop behind a school bus when its red lights are flashing. If you are going the opposite direction, you must stop in front of the bus unless there is a raised median between you and the bus.










How to Clean a Sink Trap

Maintaining a clean and clogfree sink trap is essential for the smooth operation of your kitchen or bathroom sink. Over time, debris, grease and food particles accumulate in the trap, leading to unpleasant odors and potential blockages. Here's a step-by-step guide to help you keep your sink trap clean and functioning efficiently.

Gather supplies: You'll need a bucket, a pair of rubber gloves, a pipe wrench or pliers, an old toothbrush and some mild dish soap.

Prepare the area: Place the bucket beneath the sink to catch any water or debris that may spill out during the cleaning process.

Remove the trap: Using the pipe wrench or pliers, carefully loosen the slip nuts that connect the trap to the drainpipe. Once loosened, carefully remove the trap and place it in the bucket.

Clean the trap: Use the old toothbrush and mild dish soap to scrub away any buildup and debris from the trap. Pay special attention to any hard-to-reach areas or stubborn residue.

Greassemble and test:Once the trap is clean, reassemble it and tighten the slip nuts securely. Run water through the sink to check for any leaks or drainage issues.
